

1. Return to Hockey

• Not only did we fulfill Hockey Alberta's new mandate for one female coach per female team, we continued our recruitment and development efforts to get more women involved in the game (#MomSkate2023, anyone?)

• We re-introduced the \$500 Team Development Fund, invested in goalie-specific training and offered coach development through clinics, resources and on-ice third-party instruction.

1. Health & Safety

- Resiliency of our players, parents and volunteers on how you handled yourselves amidst ever-changing and at times challenging pandemic protocols.
- Mental wellness will continue to be an issue for our young players and we must support them going forward.

2. Growth Management

• As age divisions expand, we must continue to work with Hockey Calgary to adjust our team placement and division structure strategies and address potential goaltending shortages. (Thank you U15 & U13 goalies for stepping up!)

3. Communication & Engagement

• There are so many people working hard behind the scenes, we must do better sharing information, resources and events so all members can benefit from and participate in our community.

4. Volunteers

As we grow, we need more help. Updated Volunteer Policy and opportunities at the Association and Team level.

5. Compliance & Discipline

Much time and energy was spent on members who chose not to follow our Code of Conduct.

OPERATIONS REPORT

- Safety remained our first priority in our return to hockey. Liaised with Hockey Calgary throughout the season to manage health and safety protocols from our governing bodies and facility partners.
- Expanded ice for our Community Evaluations to accommodate last-minute growth. Overall, we ran 600+ hours of ice for prep, evaluations and tryouts at ECTAS and Great Plains. Our ice scheduler, Health & Safety Coordinators, Evaluations Committee, third-party evaluators, volunteers and families were incredibly flexible and supportive.
- The Evaluations Committee is implementing improvements for next season, including:
 - # of Sessions & Session Format
 - Communication with Members
 - Communication and Resources for Internal Evaluators
 - Communication and Resources for On-Ice Help (Drills & Demos)
