Important Updates for 2022-23

1. Removing "Time Trials" as first evaluation session

Players' first skate will consist of a variety of skill assessment stations and will no longer feature timed drills. (Players will be assessed on skating, stick skills, compete, etc)

2. Changes to initial player placement

Players' initial groupings are no longer alphabetical and are based on **prior season's division** for the purpose of the first skate <u>only</u>. (Prior season's division and/or coach evaluation does not influence player movement throughout evaluation process.) Appropriate considerations are made for players who are brand new to hockey or who have joined from another association so that they begin evaluations in the appropriate skill group.

3. Improved format to showcase and assess skill

All age groups will have four evaluation sessions that will incorporate skill stations, small area games (SAG) and scrimmages.

4. Later start to the evaluation process

Community Prep Camps and Evaluations will not start until after the September long weekend to alleviate stress and avoid an abrupt end of summer for our families!

Friendly Reminders

- Should you be unable to make an evaluation session, please let your Age Group Coordinator (<u>U18coordinator@girlshockeycalgary.com</u>) know at your earliest convenience.
- Please check in at the Welcome Table before each ice time. Players will receive a helmet sticker which is to remain on their helmet for the duration of the evaluation process. Please note that the ID numbers are randomly assigned to the registration list. The ID number in no way suggests where a player is ranked within an age group.
- It is important that players are dressed and ready 10 minutes prior to their ice time.
- Due to the number of participants, players will not be accepted if they show up to the wrong session time. We are placing many players; therefore, we cannot adjust ice times.
- All parents must sit in the spectator area. No parents are allowed on the benches.
- At the discretion of the Evaluations Committee, if any member is violating the fair play
 pledge and/or putting other players at risk, they will be removed from the session and
 potentially face further consequences.
- Please ensure GHC has your correct email to receive all evaluations communication.
- As you can see by the evaluation schedule, there is very little time between sessions. In some cases, players will be skating on back-to-back days. Please know that the Evaluations Committee will be working around the clock to collect and manage scores and groupings.
 We will publish groupings with as much advance as possible and appreciate your patience.
