## Costs of U15 Elite Hockey

#### Fees are not yet set for the 2023-24 season:

- U15 AA Registration fees \$4,500.00 (approximately) which includes your GHC Fee
- These fees include a variety of base costs including ice costs, bus travel, coaching expenses, referees, team jerseys & socks, pant shells, external skills provider, dryland, mental health, league fees, Hockey Alberta and Hockey Calgary fees (including insurance) as well association administrative costs.
- In addition to the registration fees which are to be paid directly to GHC, it should be noted that this is not the extent of the total costs for families within the Elite program. There are various additional costs that are incurred each year related to travel such as hotels, meals, mandatory apparel, tournament fees, exhibition games, team equipment, provincial tournament (if team qualifies) and other miscellaneous costs.
- Additional cash calls are typically at least \$1,000-1,500 per season Failure to pay these fees may result in player being suspended until the fees are collected.

## Calgary Fire Try Out Process/Timing

\* All dates provided above are subject to change

- All athletes are guaranteed 2 ice times commencing Aug 26- Sept 2 (long weekend)
- Players who continue in the tryout process will be informed via email and player lists will be posted on the website.
- Players invited to advance to the main camps will be informed thru posting on GHC FIRE website to continue the tryout process.
- Athletes who do not advance to the next round of the tryout process will be released to community hockey.



#### Calgary Fire Try Out Process/Timing

- Aug 25<sup>th</sup> Goalies
- Aug 26<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup> Scrimmages-Released players will continue on with community hockey evaluations after this ice time (TBD), continuing elite player rosters will be posted on the GHC website
- Aug 29<sup>th</sup> & 30<sup>th</sup> Scrimmages-Released players will continue on to community hockey evaluations after this ice time (TBD), continuing elite player rosters will be posted on the GHC website
- Aug 31<sup>st</sup> or Sept 1<sup>st</sup> (TBC)-Fitness Testing
- Sept 2<sup>nd</sup> AA Red and White Game, not all players will play in the Red and White game but will still be eligible for draft. After the initial draft there will still be further releases to community hockey

Coaches have the option to alter a player position (i.e. choose Defense player to play Forward for the team)

### Elite Team Formation

- The Calgary Fire U15 AA teams are drafted by their respective coaching staff. Coaching staff
  make decisions to select or draft players based on many different attributes including on ice
  play, work/effort, off ice conduct, team play, leadership qualities, character,
  offensive/defensive skill sets, amongst others.
- We have three Calgary Fire U15AA teams: 17 player spots with 2 goalie spots per team.
   Player are trying out from a variety of levels: U15A or U15B teams, U13AA (in GHC or not),
   U13 tier 1-2-3-4 and new players to GHC. For example if you played U13AA, it does not guarantee you will make Calgary Fire.
- This is not an evaluation or committee selection; this is a tryout. Players who are released will continue on to community level hockey within GHC.
- Parents will not have any influence on whether their child will make a team, however, they
  can definitely have influence on their child NOT making the team. Let your child play and do
  not interfere with their tryout process.
- Undoubtedly there will be some disappointed athletes and parents through this selection/draft process and team formation. Please note that the selection/draft process and coaching decisions are final. Athletes do not have the opportunity to appeal the coaches' selections.

## Calgary Fire Expectations of Athletes

- Always conduct yourself in a professional manner both on and off the ice; coaches evaluate players both on and off the ice
- Red/White games players are expected to dress in game day clothing
- Cell Phone/Social Media stay away from social media at all costs; everyone is watching including post-secondary schools
- Absolutely no cell phones in the dressing room, except as designated (music and medical necessity)- zero tolerance.
- Zero tolerance for athletes who have been in contact with drugs, alcohol, tobacco or vaping products during any Calgary Fire event
- Further Team Rules may/will be applied by each individual team coach accordingly
- Players must read and sign the statement of acknowledgement document which is in the <u>Calgary Fire Member Policy Manual</u>



## Calgary Fire Expectations of Parents

- Demonstrate pride and exemplary conduct when participating in team activities.
- Demonstrate model sportsmanship, respect, and appreciation for all players, off and on-ice officials, volunteers and coaches at all times.
- Understand and comply with GHC elite philosophy, bylaws, expectations, policies, procedures, and operations and assume responsibility for his/her actions.
- Support your daughter in making a firm commitment to participate in all team activities, her development as a hockey player and contributor to the team
- Parents must read and sign the statement of acknowledgement document which is in the <u>Calgary Fire Member Policy Manual</u>



## Volunteerism/Fundraising

- Fundraising is a crucial component to the success of Calgary Fire Hockey. It
  is expected that all families will work to secure funding for the program
  and will do their utmost to contribute to Calgary Fire fundraising
  campaigns
- Each family is expected to commit to volunteering for the betterment of all Calgary Fire teams, both with and without volunteer credits awarded.
- 3 credit (Association credit and Team credit) or \$500.00 volunteer bond buy out paid at registration
- Calgary FireStarter volunteering (credits TBD) is mandated and in addition to the new 3 credits volunteer requirements
- All fundraising goes back to the Calgary Fire program



# Rawlyk Family Fund and other available funding

- A financial sponsorship program is available to qualified GHC female elite athletes. The program, supported by the Rawlyk Family Foundation, is designed to assist those elite players with both the desire and potential to compete at the post-secondary level, but who are unable to participate due to personal financial restrictions. Criteria for selection of successful applicants:
- 1. Financial need
- 2. Academic standing
- 3. Hockey ability (AAA, AA or A division player with potential to play at the elite level)
- 4. Sportsmanship and/or community participation/service
- 5. Eligibility currently registered with Girls Hockey Calgary in U15 or U18.
